

Ozark Waltz

This sweet waltz was originally recorded in 1930 by the Morrison Brothers, Abbie and Absie, along with Abbie's sons Claude and Lawson. They left Stone County on the train from Allison to Memphis to do the recording. There would have been banjo on the recording, but the banjo player broke a string. Back in those days, people couldn't afford to simply keep extra strings on hand. The song was done at a brisk pace in the key of F. This transcription is taken more from the Buck Mountain String Band version in the key of D to accommodate students at this level.
